A meeting of some civil society organizations and other stakeholders from various walks of life will be organized from 30<sup>th</sup> Nov-2<sup>nd</sup> Dec 2012 in Mahabaleshwar.

#### THE HISTORIC SAHYADRI CAMPAIGN

Save the Western Ghats Movement, which is recognized as one of the pioneering social-ecological movements in India, owed its origin to a 100 day historic march across the length of the Western Ghats covering six states. In the year 1987/88, a group of passionate and enthusiastic people, united by the cause of conserving the ecological and cultural diversity of the Western Ghats came together for the 'Save the Western Ghats March'. This group comprised members of the local communities, local organizations, media, civil society groups and government officials. This 100 day awareness campaign was an endeavour to enhance their understanding of the ecological status and developmental needs within these mighty mountains.


#### IN THE INTERIM

The mountain chain called Western Ghats. covers 51 districts in six states, is one of the 34 global biodiversity hotspots and is home to many indigenous communities. These mountains are under tremendous pressure and the ecology and environment is at stake. In these 25 years, spurred on by globalization, a flawed policy environment and changing value systems of the local communities, new problems have been created in the area and old issues, persist with an increased intensity and impact. In such a situation, the need for civil society to deliberate and to search for inclusive solutions in pursuit of sustainable development is far more urgent now than ever before.

#### **WAKING UP!!!**

Since 2009 a group of committed organizations and individuals working in Western Ghats, have been organizing annual meetings to bring together stakeholders of Western Ghats and have created a platform to initiate collective action again. The Annual meeting of 2009 was held at Goa in February by Peaceful Society Goa, in 2010 at Kotagiri Tamil Nadu by Keystone Foundation, in 2011 by Prakruti at Moodbidri Karnataka. The meeting of 2012 is being organized in Maharashtra by Applied Environmental Research Foundation.





#### **MAHABALESHWAR 2012**

This Practitioners' Conclave is an attempt to bring together the various civil society groups and stakeholders in order to discuss pressing ecological, economic and social issues leading to sustainable solutions and strategies for the region. The meeting will carve new partnerships, strengthen the existing ones and develop concrete long term action plans for sustainable development in Western Ghats.

The four major challenges that are of paramount importance for maintaining the grandeur and ecological integrity of the Western Ghats as well as to civil society have been identified and will be discussed during the meeting.
